

GRADING GUIDELINES FOR K-4

Pre-kindergarten and kindergarten successes are indicated by mastery in a wide variety of academic skills, activities, and social skills.

First grade students are graded at the following three levels: “S” indicates satisfactory progress with good work and study habits, “S-” indicates satisfactory progress with minor discrepancies in one or more areas, and “U” indicates unsatisfactory progress with work that does not meet assigned requirements.

Second, third, and fourth grade students are scored with the traditional system. Scores of 90% to 100% receive an A, 80% to 89% receive a B, 70% to 79% receive a C, 60% to 69% receive a D, and 59% and below receive an F.

At the 5th week of each grading period, parents will be notified by mail or by phone if their child has a grade that is considered unsatisfactory of below a C. If a parent wishes to be notified otherwise, that parent should schedule a conference with the student’s teacher.
