

**DRUG-FREE SCHOOLS
STUDENT DRUG ABUSE
(REGULATION)**

Students are prohibited from being under the influence of or having in their possession or using or selling any of the following mood-altering chemicals in school or at school-sponsored activities:

1. Alcoholic beverages
2. Marijuana, hashish, or any cannabis derivative
3. Amphetamines (speed, white cross, cocaine, etc.)
4. Phencyclidines (PCP, angel dust, etc.)
5. All hallucinatory chemicals (LSD, mescaline, and others)
6. Barbiturates
7. Opiates
8. Other mood-altering chemicals that can hinder the student's ability to learn or participate and could cause damage to the student's health.
9. Any other controlled dangerous substance prohibited by the laws of the State of Oklahoma.

Each school will provide services for students experiencing problems related to chemical use or chemical dependency. These services will include:

1. Interviews and assessment by qualified staff trained in the identification process.
2. Confidential referral of students and/or family members to appropriate agencies.
3. Group-structured services within the school day.
4. Assistance and support for individual students when needed.

Once it has been determined that a student has used, possessed, distributed, or sold drugs, tobacco, or alcohol or is under the influence of drugs or alcohol at school or at a school related activity, the building principal shall implement the following procedures:

1. The police will be promptly notified of the offense by the building principal, which will include a description of the substance plus any physical evidence obtained.
2. The student will be suspended from school in accordance with the district's student suspension policy and the student's parents or guardian will be called to remove the student immediately from school property, if not by police

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- 3. In addition to suspension from school, the student will forfeit the privilege of participating in any and all extracurricular or co-curricular activities.
- 4. The student's parents or guardian will be asked to meet with the school administrator(s) and members of the staff during the first four days of suspension for the purpose of determining a specific plan for monitoring the student's subsequent behavior. If a satisfactory plan is developed within this four school day period, the suspension may be reduced.

Given reasonable suspicion of a particular student that he student is in possession of an illegal substance including any prohibited item or paraphernalia , school officials may search the individual student for, and seize, alcoholic beverages and illegal drugs including tobacco and tobacco products brought onto school buses or school property and submit such drugs to the proper authorities for analysis.
